Ladies and gentlemen,

Since May 2015 the World Health Organisation has been coordinating a global campaign to raise awareness of antibiotic resistance. In this campaign best practices among the public, policymakers, health care and agriculture professionals are encouraged, in order to avoid further emergence and spread of antibiotic resistance.
